Yesterday I stood in awe as I watched a hummingbird take the nectar from one of our gladiola. For three minutes it fed, taking the goodness from each of the blossoms on that one flower. It was a beautiful thing to observe. A first for me! And I admit it; I found myself crying in wonder. The inter-connectedness of God's creation always gets me that way. A beautiful flower becomes nourishment for a tiny bird, and his feeding frenzy becomes a joy-inspiring sight for my eyes to behold. Those few moments will forever, I think, be etched in my mind.

As I stood watching I was reminded of the verse in Psalm 34:8: "Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the man who takes refuge in Him."

and sustain and fortify me. I need to find my strength and my refuge in You. Give me the desire to taste and see Your goodness. Make me like that hummingbird God, focused and intent on receiving the blessings You have for me."

I was reminded of a hymn that we sang in Sunday School many years ago,

All things bright and beautiful,
All creatures great and small,
All things wise and wonderful,
The LORD God made them all.
Each little flower that opens,
Each little bird that sings,
God made their glowing colours.
He made their tiny wings.
