The LORD, the Shepherd of His People

It has been quite some time since we met together for prayer, praise and worship. We were suddenly thrust into staying our distance away and isolation. At first, it was understandable, but then it became more demanding, and we realized we were very much alone because of the separation from each

other. Psalm 23 has always been a comfort and strength to me no matter what I may be enjoying or facing in life. During this pandemic it has become more important to me for facing each day.

I began to have new understanding of the meaning of our Lord being "Our Shepherd". A Shepherd, of course, is one who looks after and cares for (in this case) a herd of sheep. He tends to their needs and wounds and safety. The Bible often refers to us as 'sheep' and we certainly know how much we need to be tenderly cared for.

- He (Jesus) is our shepherd......He looks after our every need ... we are not in need
- We have green pastures to graze upon ..plenteous of food.
- We are led by still waters; sheep are afraid of rushing waters and so with his hands, Jesus forms a still area for them to drink from. We have many days of unrest, but Jesus has a way to bring us peace.
- -Our souls are restored as we continue to rely upon and trust His promises.
- -As we pray and read His word, we are reminded that as He leads us, our walk cannot go wrong. All we are required to do is follow.
- -We realize there are many things in this life that could harm us or even cause our death, yet we are reminded that Jesus will never leave us or forsake us. He continues to protect us and to lift us up from danger. He is with us in the pandemics we go through.
- -Even though things and people could harm us at any time, He prepares and provides for us with needed provision.
- -We are given assurance that we are His through His anointing us.
